Cork LGBTI+ Awareness Week 2024

Theme: 'A Safe City For All'

Cork marks May 17th, the International Day Against Homophobia. Lesbophobia, Transphobia and Biphobia (IDAHOBIT) annually by organising an LGBTI+ Awareness Week. In a world grown increasingly intolerant and threatening, the importance of marking IDAHOBIT is essential.

The world has just celebrated the 75th anniversary of the Universal **Declaration of Human Rights** — a document that is much more than a cornerstone of international law: it is a guide to navigate a deeply divided world, a set of values that everyone can live by, and ultimately a force for good.

And vet, we know that "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights" represents a promise not vet fulfilled — for LGBTI+ people across the world, and for everyone experiencing the suffocating impact on their lives of diverse lavers of inequalities.

2022 was reported by ILGA, the International Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, most violent year for LGBTI+ people. In Ireland, we have experienced that

at the same time as efforts are underway to criminalise Hate Crime. At a time when hard-won advances for LGBTI+ communities around the globe are increasingly under threat, the power of solidarity, allyship and community across identities, borders. and movements has never been more necessary.

The Cork I GBTI+ Awareness Week 2024 theme is 'A Safe City For All' which will be explored at various events throughout the week. This theme is a call for unity: only through solidarity for each other will we create a world without injustice. where no one is left behind.

We invite you to attend an event, come together to challenge homophobia, lesbophobia, transphobia, and biphobia and to demonstrate the solidarity of the people of Cork with LGBTI+ communities, here and globally.


