An tArd-Mheara recited the opening prayer.

2. **MINUTES**

Minutes of Ordinary Meeting of An Chomhairle held on 8th July 2002 were considered and approved.

3. **SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS**

Seanoir C. O'Connell proposed and Comhairleoir J. O'Brien seconded that Standing Orders be suspended to discuss the Differential Rent Scheme.

As the requisite two-thirds majority was not reached, An tArd-Mheara declared the motion lost.

4. **QUESTION TIME**

4.1 **ROAD MARKING IN ONSLOW GARDENS**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir C. Burke a written reply was circulated which stated that a sum of money has been included in this year's Roads Programme to undertake the necessary upgrade of road lining and signage in Onslow Gardens. However, due to the effects of the extended spell of wet weather, our yearly road lining programme has been severely disrupted and it has not been possible to undertake such work as yet. Nevertheless, subject to an improvement in weather conditions and granted an extended period of dry weather in the coming weeks, we would hope to have the programme of works envisaged for Onslow Gardens completed by September of this year.

4.2 **MAXOL SITE ADJACENT TO AVONMORE PARK**

In response to question submitted by Seanoir M. Quill a written reply was circulated which stated that the former Maxol garage site at Old Youghal Road was entered on the Derelict Sites Register on 29th December 2000, in accordance with the Derelict Sites Act 1990, and is subject to a derelict sites levy.

The owner of this site has obtained full planning permission for two developments at this site:

1. The development of 6 no. townhouses to the rear of the former service station site.
2. The development of a service station and shop.

The owner is currently in negotiations to sell this property to a developer. It is, therefore, not considered appropriate at this time to commence compulsory acquisition procedures on this derelict site. The situation will be kept under review.

4.3 **RAILING OPPOSITE HOLLYWOOD ESTATE**

In response to question submitted by Seanoir D. McCarthy a written reply was circulated which stated that contact has been made with the contractor in relation to this matter and we are awaiting a start date.

It should be noted that it is bollards that are being erected and not fencing around this green space. The Parks Dept. will notify the Council once a start date has been agreed.

4.4 **BLOCK OPENING AT ROUNDVILLE, ONSLOW**

In response to question submitted by Seanoir D. McCarthy & Comhairleoir J. O'Brien a written reply was circulated which stated that Roundville has been added to the running list of requests for lane closures. The proposal to block up the opening will be considered at the next meeting of the North West Ward.

4.5 **REFURBISHMENT SHANDON STREET**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir D. Wallace, a written reply was circulated which stated that :

1. Tenders have been received and are being evaluated at present .
Work will commence on Shandon Street, toward the end of August .
2. The meetings which have been held with most residents and traders will be ongoing.
3. The draft plan results from the consultation process.

4.6 **ERECTION OF NAMEPLATES AT GLENVIEW**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir T. Brosnan, a written reply was circulated which stated that Messrs. McInerney Construction Limited have been requested to erect nameplates at Glenview Park, Dillons Cross and have confirmed that they will arrange to have this work undertaken.

4.7 **PERSONS WITH SERVICE CHARGE & RENT ARREARS**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir J. O'Brien, a written reply was circulated which stated that :

1. Disabled Persons Grants

The existing policy is to check for arrears at application stage and to notify applicants to clear arrears where such exist. In cases where there are service charge arrears, the Housing Department will accept part payment of arrears provided that a reasonable agreement is made to pay the balance.

Where rent arrears exist and arrears agreement is in force and being adhered to, applications are not delayed. Applications will however be delayed in cases where arrears exist and no agreement is made to clear same or in cases where previous agreements have been broken.

2. Allocations

The existing policy is not to offer an allocation where arrears exist.

4.8 **ALLOCATION OF HOUSES TO TRAVELLING COMMUNITY**

In response to the question submitted by Seanoir T. Shannon, a written reply was circulated which stated that :

- A. Under the scheme of letting priorities, twenty-eight traveller families were allocated housing by both Cork City Council and the voluntary housing associations in the past three years. These can be broken down as follows:

- B. Four members of the travelling community were housed by the city council housing department and voluntary housing associations in Mahon between the years 1999 to 2002. Their average waiting period on the housing list was three and a half years.
- C. All lettings of dwellings are made in accordance with the Scheme of Letting Priorities adopted by Council in September, 1997. It is not the stated policy of the City Council Housing Department to house members of the travelling community in specific houses identified by them in Mahon or in any other area.
- It is policy to house applicants, where possible, in the areas of the applicants choice as indicated in his/her application form.
- D. It is not the stated policy of the City Council housing department or other housing associations to house members of the travelling community next door, across the road, or within sight of other members of their family already housed in the area.
- E. Cork City Council has a Housing Welfare Officer specifically dedicated to dealing with traveller issues. It is part of the process when allocating a dwelling to a traveller family for the Housing Welfare Officer to assist this family in settling in and integrating into the local community and to provide access to such other statutory agencies as may be required.

- F. No member of the travelling community has been evicted by Cork City Council or other housing association for engaging in anti-social behaviour.
- G. The property at 13, Beechwood Court, Mahon, was purchased in 2002 as an addition to the housing stock. The cost of pre-tenancy work was approximately €4,950.

The property at 1, St. Michael's Lawn, Mahon, was purchased in 2001 as an addition to the housing stock. The cost of pre-tenancy work was approximately €1260. The property at 26, Inchera Lawn, Mahon, is currently unoccupied due to tenant vacating the property. Works are currently being undertaken to prepare the house for reallocation. The estimated final cost of these works is €14,000.

5. **VACANCIES**

5.1 **VACANCY IN CITY COUNCIL**

An Chomhairle considered the filling of the Casual Vacancy arising from the resignation of Comhairleoir D. Boyle and wished Deputy Boyle well in the future.

An Chomhairle noted that Chris O'Leary of the Green Party had indicated in writing that he was agreeable to take up the vacancy.

It was agreed on the proposal of Comhairleoir K. Lynch T.D., seconded by Comhairleoir D. Wallace to co-opt Mr. Chris O'Leary to fill the casual vacancy and An tArdmheara declared him appointed.

An tArdmheara, Members of an Chomhairle and the City Manager on behalf of staff welcomed Comhairleoir Chris O'Leary and wished him well.

6. **CORPORATE POLICY GROUP**

6.1 **FINANCIAL STATEMENT**

An Chomhairle approved the report of the City Manager on Financial Statement to 30th June 2002.

6.2 **BANK OVERDRAFT FOR HALF YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 2002**

In accordance with the recommendation of the Corporate Policy Group from its meeting held on 15th July 2002, An Chomhairle approved the report of the City Manager dated 4th July 2002 on the Bank overdraft for the second-half year to the 31st December 2002. The report stated that approval is requested to increase the level of Cork City Council's Overdraft Facility to €10m (Ten Million Euro) for the second-half year to the 31st December 2002.

Approval is requested for the present level in order to provide for the maximum limits which may occur having regard to the Revenue and Capital Account Balances during the period. The level for the comparable period in 2001 was €7.6m (approx) (Seven Million and Six Hundred Thousand Euro approx)

7. **SHANDON ACTION PLAN**

An Chomhairle approved and complimented the City Manager and all the staff involved in the preparation of the Plan and noted Comhairleoir M. Quill's suggestion that the Shandon Festival be revived.

8. **WEBWORKS**

An Chomhairle on the proposal of Comhairleoir J. Corr, seconded by Comhairleoir K. Lynch T.D, approved in principle the making available of the site at Albert Quay House.

9. **ADOPTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION GRANTS SCHEME 2002**

An Chomhairle adopted the scheme and on the proposal of Comhairleoir B. Bermingham, seconded by Comhairleoir M. Quill agreed that a letter be sent to the Minister for Education requesting that the registration fee to be awarded by Local Authorities be increased to the current registration fee.

“That the serious problems experienced by the residents of Uamvar Estate in relation to faulty and inadequate sewage system are addressed immediately. I am requesting that this matter is treated as a

priority to ensure that resources are made available to speedily investigate the best course of action to take to remedy the problem and that adequate funding is made available to carry out the work.”

The report of the Director of Services which indicated that commitments in regard to solutions to specific individual difficulties are being fulfilled and the overall problem of capacity limitations on the drainage network is currently being assessed. This assessment will also include costing of various options and a) the consideration of implementation will be dependent on the availability of funding in next year’s programme.
