MONDAY 24th JUNE 2002**

1. **SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS**

Seanoir D. McCarthy proposed and Comhairleoir T. Falvey, seconded that standing orders be suspended to discuss the FAS Schemes. A Vote was called for where there appeared:-

As the requisite two thirds majority was not reached, An t-Ard-Mheara declared the motion lost.

2. **MINUTES**

Minutes of Ordinary Meeting of An Chomhairle held on 10th June 2002, were considered and approved.

3. **CORK CITY COUNCIL WEBSITE AWARD**

An Chomhairle noted report of City Manager dated 19th June on the Cork City Council Website award.

4. **PARKS DEPARTMENT ACHIEVEMENT OF ISO QUALITY CERTIFICATE**

An Chomhairle noted report of City Manager dated 19th June on the Achievement of the Parks Department of ISO Quality Certificate.

5. **NORTH WEST REGIONAL PARK**

An Chomhairle approved the convening of a Special Meeting of the Committee of Whole Council to receive presentation by Senior Executive Parks Superintendent on proposal to develop north West Regional Park.

6. **FINANCIAL STATEMENT – APRIL 2002**

An Chomhairle approved the Financial Statement for May 2002.

7. **QUESTION TIME**

7.1 **FOOTPATH REPLACEMENT PROGRAMME**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir B. Allen T.D., a written reply was circulated which stated that the work covered under these contracts consists principally of the replacement of temporary reinstatements with permanent reinstatements on footways throughout the city. The backlog of work connected with the raising of services on resurfaced roads is also included.

The contracts were advertised on 1st February 2002 and thirteen tenders were received by the 25th February 2002 closing date. The tenders were assessed and based on the rates submitted, three contractors were appointed:- McGinty & O'Shea Ltd., Core Engineering Ltd. and Martin O'Callaghan Ltd. Each was given areas on a geographical basis in order to cover the entire city.

7.2 **CLAMPING IN CORK CITY**

In response to question submitted by Seanoir T. Shannon PC., a written reply was circulated which stated that :-

- (a) A notice in accordance with EU Public Service Procurement Directive 92/50/EEC was sent to the EU Journal on the 8th February 2002 and the closing date for tenders was 2nd April 2002. A notice was also placed in the national newspapers. All tenders have been evaluated in accordance with the criteria set down in the tender documents and we are now in a position to award the contract. The tendering process is therefore complete.
- (b) Seven applications were received for tender documents and a set of documents was sent to each applicant. Three completed tenders were submitted. Following the process described in a) above the contract is being awarded to Central parking Systems, 13 Windsor Place, Dublin 2.

The contract is for a three year period with an option for a two year extension. The exercising of this option, which would be based on negotiation, is at the sole discretion of Cork City Council.

- (c) The new operator will carry out his functions under the following guidelines:
 - i) Road Traffic (Traffic & Parking) Regulations 1997.
These are national regulations and are issued by the Minister for the Environment under the Road Traffic Acts.
 - ii) Cork (County Borough) Disc Parking Area Bye-Laws 1998.
These regulations are issued and approved by the City Council under the Road Traffic Acts.

The fees for release or declamping of a vehicle are set down in The Road Traffic (Immobilisation of Vehicles) Regulations 1998, the Road Traffic (Removal, Storage and Disposal of Vehicles) Regulations 1983 and 1998. These are issued by the Minister for the Environment under Road Traffic Acts.

All vehicles which are illegally parked as defined in the above regulations are liable to be clamped or towed. Cork City Council, however, does not generally tow vehicles for contravention of The Disc Parking Bye-Laws. Clamping only is employed here.

- d) Clamping was introduced on the 29th August 2001. From that time up to the end of May (nine months) 3810 vehicles were clamped.
For the twelve months ended 31st May 3190 vehicles were towed.
The financial benefit to the City Council for the nine month period, September 2001 –May 2002, when towing and clamping was in operation was €96,000.

7.3 **REFURBISHMENT OF PATRICK STREET**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir T. Brosnan, a written reply was circulated which stated that :-

- (a) The Refurbishment of Patrick Street has commenced.
- (b) The expected completion date is June 2004
- (c) Cork City Council is unable to undertake the refurbishment of Grand Parade at this stage due to lack of funds.
- (d) The section being undertaken at present is from Patrick's Bridge to Daunt Square. The estimated cost of this is in the order of €11.4 million. The estimated cost of the completed scheme that was tendered, which extends as far as the Washington Street Junction, is estimated at €15.8 million.
- (e) We have requested funds under the Village & Urban Renewal Scheme from the Department of the Environment and Local Government towards the scheme. They have indicated verbally that in the order of €4.9 million will be available from this scheme towards the Patrick Street project.
- (f) We are not aware of any government finance that has been available for O'Connell Street in Dublin.

7.4 **LEISURE CENTRE IN CHURCHFIELD**

In response to question submitted by Seanoir D. McCarthy, a written reply was circulated which stated that Detailed design plans have now been finalised for the refurbishment of Churchfield Swimming Pool. Application was made for additional grant aid under the Sports Capital Programme for the gym facilities and the Department of Tourism, Sport and Recreation by letter dated 7th May 2002 confirmed a further sum of €400,000 for this element of the project.

The detailed design plans show some changes (improvements) over original plans. Planning process under Part 8 of the Local Government (Planning and Development) Regulations 2001 will commence this week. A Prior Information

Notice was placed in EU Journal on the 29th May 2002 advising prospective tenderers of works – tenders will be sought shortly with works expected to commence in the Autumn.

8. **DISPOSAL OF TURF STORES AT POULADUFF ROAD CORK**

An Chomhairle deferred consideration of the Disposal of Turf Stores at Pouladuff Road Cork

9. **STANDING ORDERS**

An Chomhairle approved the setting up of a sub – committee to consider revised Standing Orders compiled in compliance with the requirements of the Local Government Act 2001.

10. **HOUSE PURCHASES**

An Chomhairle considered the report of the Director of Services on the following motion, deferred from meeting of Council of 10th June 2002.

“That Cork City Council as a matter of policy would not purchase more than 5% of houses in any terrace, park or estate for the purpose of social housing and that such purchases within the 5% limit would be purchased evenly across the entire City.’

(Proposer: Comhairleoir T. Brosnan Ref. 02/131)

The report stated that Cork City Council must have regard to the terms of Circular N3/92 in carrying out its housing functions. This Circular sets out the National Policy on Social Integration.

The Housing Department is sensitive to the concerns of residents in determining where houses will be purchased in private estates but empirical evidence shows that Cork City Council tenants settle very well in private estates and that concerns of residents have in the main been unfounded.

It should be noted that over 3,000 applicants are eligible for Local Authority housing and the Council has a duty too provide for the needs of those applicants.

The introduction of a limit may prohibit the Council for the performance of its functions.

An t-Ard Mheara declared the motion approved.

11. **ARTS GRANTS 2002**

An Chomhairle approved the Arts Grants 2002. An Chomhairle also approved that the Corporate Policy Group be requested to give consideration to increasing Arts Grants between now and 2005 in light of the European Capital of Culture

11.1 **CHANGING FACILITIES, TED McCARTHY MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSE**

An Chomhairle approved the report of the A/Director of Services in relation to changing facilities at the Ted McCarthy Municipal Golf Course was considered by the Committee. In his report, the Director stated that previous plans for changing facilities had proved prohibitively expensive but with agreement of the Joint Golf Management Committee tenders has been sought for a redesigned building with reduced floor area. Tenders had now been received which indicated costs in the region of €960,000 to construct new facilities incorporating changing rooms, showers, golf shop, club meeting room etc.

Application had also been made to the Department of Tourism, Sport and Recreation for funding, and by letter of 7th May 2002 confirmation had been received of €300,000 grant aid. Together with previous Department grant of €63,000, a balance of €600,000 would be required to be funded by Cork City Council.

It was now recommended to proceed with the project and commence Part 8 Planning Process under the Local Government (Planning and Development) Regulations 2001. It was expected that works could commence in early Autumn.

11.2 **DANGEROUS TREES/GLANMIRE ROAD**

An Chomhairle approved the report on the following motion:-

“That Cork City Council arrange for the dangerous trees to the rear of Nos. 37, 38 and 39 Ard na Laoi, Middle Glanmire Road be cut back as a matter of urgency as they pose a serious danger to residents and children playing in the area.”

(Proposer:- Comhairleoir T. Brosnan – Ref. 02/13)

The report of the A/Director of Services stated that the trees would be surveyed and appropriate works carried out if necessary.

11.3 **CLEAN UP AT VICTORIA AVENUE/BOREENMANNA ROAD**

An Chomhairle approved the report on the following motion:-

“That Cork Corporation clean up the area of waste ground at the corner of Victoria Avenue and the Boreenmanna Road. This area should be landscaped, grassed and seating provided for local residents, which would compliment the green area opposite by Glenanaar”

(Proposer:- Seanoir T. Shannon – Ref. 01/241)

The report of the A/Director of Services stated that the area had been cleaned up and would be monitored weekly was also considered. The area of land in question was not in Council ownership and inquiries would be followed up with the Property Department regarding ownership and the Planning Department in relation to possible use of the Derelict Sites Act 1990.

11.4 **CLOSE REMAINING PARTS OF THE GREEN AT THE RESERVOIR**

An Chomhairle approved the report on the following motion:-

“That the City Council act immediately to close off the remaining parts of the green area around the reservoir in Harbour View Road, to stop the illegal camping of members of the travelling community on the site which is close to housing estate on both sides of the road.”

(Proposer:- Comhairleoir M. O’Connell – Ref. 02/151)

The report of the A/Director of Services stated that measures were in hand to prevent access to the area around the reservoir.

12. **ENVIRONMENT STRATEGIC POLICY COMMITTEE**

12.1 **ENERGY POLICY**

An Chomhairle approved the report of Director of Services on Energy Policy for Cork City Council.

12.2 **CAR FREE DAY**

An Chomhairle approved the report of the Director of Services on Car Free Day 2001.

The Report indicated that Cork City together with 9 other cities and towns throughout the European Union took part. The aim of the exercise was to promote alternative means of transport to the private car and to contribute to an improved urban environment.

The Cork activities were organised by the Cork City Energy Agency, Cork City Council's Traffic Section in association with Bus Eireann, the Gardai and other local stakeholders.

A survey undertaken on the day indicated a high degree of satisfaction with the initiative and most persons surveyed were of the view that car free day should be repeated.

Members expressed the view that the car free day should be promoted and the feasibility of having extra car free days during the year should also be investigated.

12.3 **LANDFILL SITE**

An Chomhairle approved the report of the Director of Services on the following motion :-

‘That Cork City Council rescind the recently introduced charge for the disposal of grass and hedge cuttings by private residents at the City Municipal land fill site.’

(Proposer: Seanoir T. Shannon, Comhairleoiri S. Martin & T. Brosnan Ref. 02/140)

The Report of the Director of Services which indicated that City Council under its waste licence is required to undertake some composting at the Landfill Site and that this requirement is currently being carried out by a competent firm under normal tendering procedures was considered. City Council has to pay for this service, and under the Polluter Pays principle has to recoup the cost from the users of the facility i.e. the general public and any contractors and as a result the rescinding of the charges recently imposed was not recommended.

12.4 **OPENING HOURS AT LAND FILL SITE**

An Chomhairle considered the following motion and the report of the Director of Services:-

‘That this Council rescind charge on garden waste brought for collection at the Sanitary landfill Site, Kinsale Road, and further that the opening hours at the landfill site be restored to their previous longer hours’.

(Proposer: Comhairleoir D. Boyle Ref. 02/148)

The Report of the Director of Services which indicated that City Council under its waste licence is required to undertake some composting at the landfill Site and that this requirement is currently being carried out by a competent firm under normal tendering procedures was considered. City Council has to pay for this service, and under the Polluter Pays principle has to recoup the cost from the users of the facility i.e. the general public and any contractors and as a result the rescinding of the charges recently imposed was not recommended.

In relation to the shortened operating hours the Report stated that these had been introduced to reflect the reductions in waste volumes, to increase efficiency and to comply with the legislative requirements of the Organisation of Working Time Act 1997.

A vote on the motion was called for where there appeared, 5 votes for the motion and 6 votes against the motion.

An t Ard Mheara declared the motion defeated.
