3. **MINUTES**

An Chomhairle approved the Minutes of Council held on 11th March 2002 subject to the following amendment: that the Minutes of 2(a) regarding a grant to be made available to Wilton Soccer Club should be amended to reflect the meeting. The minutes to read: the report of the Director of Services was rejected by an Chomhairle. The City Manager stated that he understood the Councillors wishes and it was agreed that the report would be sent back to Committee outlining Councillors wishes i.e. funding or equivalent in kind e.g. fencing.

4. **QUESTION TIME**

4.1 **INSTALLATION OF A BOX JUNCTION ON HIGH STREET ADJACENT TO RAILWAY PLACE**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir S. Martin, the following written reply was circulated which stated that there are over 30 yellow boxes to be installed as part of this year’s road painting programme. The road painting season starts at this time of the year when weather conditions improve. The installation of the yellow box at the junction of High Street/Railway Place has been identified as a priority and it will be done in the near future.

4.2 **ST. LUKES CHURCH**

In response to question submitted by Seanoir N. O’Flynn, the following written reply was circulated which stated that the terms have not yet been finalised. If the Representative Church Body in Dublin approves the proposed transfer the detailed terms will then be addressed.

No, nothing has been agreed with regard to the Church Yard at Shandon.

It is not possible to answer this query until the future of the Church Yard, as to whether it remains in Church ownership or comes into local authority ownership, has been resolved. There are ongoing discussions in this regard.

4.3 **SAFETY MEASURES ON ROADWAYS WITHIN RESIDENTIAL HOUSING ESTATES**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir B. Bermingham, the following written reply was circulated which stated that fixed speed cameras have recently been used as part of a pilot project in the Dublin area. They are a speed enforcement tool and were managed and controlled by the Gardaí. Result data from the trials is awaited.

While they are a very effective form of traffic speed enforcement, they are generally only used on major national traffic routes with large traffic volumes. They are extremely expensive to install and maintain, and it is unlikely they would ever be used on minor or residential estate roads. Cork City Council will keep itself informed of developments in this area and will bring any appropriate proposals to Council.

4.4 **RESURFACING OF THE ROAD IN COURTOWN PARK**

In response to question submitted by Seanoir D. McCarthy, the following written reply was circulated which stated that Courtown Park is on the list of roads for resurfacing in the current year under Section F – Special Resurfacing Programme 2002. The closing date for receipt of tenders for this contract was 15th March 2002.

The contractor, when appointed will present a programme of work covering the forty five roads included in the contract and the resurfacing of Courtown Park will form part of that programme. The contract will be carried out during the summer/autumn of the current year and it is not possible now to determine exactly when Courtown Park will be resurfaced during this period.

4.5 **TAKING CHARGE OF WOODLANDS, MONTENOTTE**

In response to question submitted by T. Brosnan, the following written reply was circulated which stated that the housing estate Woodlands, Montenotte has already been advertised, however a problem arose in a sewer which serves the development. The developer is presently repairing the defect and when the repaired sewer will have been reinspected and passed, it is the intention of the Roads Directorate to put the adoption of the estate to the City Council.

4.6 **PLAYING PITCH IN MAHON**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir D. Clune, the following written reply was circulated which stated that the application for funding under the Sports Capital Programme 2002 to develop 5 no. sports pitches at Mahon was made to the Dept. of Tourism, Sport and Recreation in January 2002.

Should this application be successful, Pitch development works will commence during Summer 2002 and the Pitches will be ready for use by Spring 2004.

4.7 **PUBLIC PARK AT THE KINSALE ROAD LANDFILL**

In response to question submitted by Seanoir John Dennehy, the following written reply was circulated which stated that final capping of approximately 20% of total

area of active landfill to be capped is programmed to commence in early summer 2002. The area to be capped is the eastern most part of the site. These works are likely to be completed by end 2002/ early 2003.

It is anticipated that Contracts 4 and 5 will be completed at year end and following works will then be complete:- fencing, civic amenity site, surface water and leachate collection systems, leachate pre-treatment plant, lagoons and reed beds.

Furthermore, as stated above in a separate contract, final capping, grassing and gas collection systems will be in place in respect of 20% of active area of the site.

4.8 **CORK RECREATIONAL NEEDS SURVEY**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir D. Boyle, the following written reply was circulated which stated that The Cork Recreational Needs Study was undertaken in 1997 at a cost of £30,000. The purpose of the Study was to review existing provision of sport and recreation facilities in the Greater Cork area in terms of quality and quantity, and assess future need for same.

The Report made a number of recommendations in relation to development and management of Playing facilities within the study area. Some of the recommendations have been included in City Council's Parks Strategy and are also included in the Corporate Plan 2001 – 2004 under Recreation and Amenity objectives.

The Reports findings have also been used to advise both Cork City Council and Cork County Council on possible recreational uses for lands in the Greater Cork area. A number of clubs have used the Report to assist with grant applications under the Sports Capital Programme.

New Consultants have recently been appointed to carry out a new Study covering period 2002 – 2007.

4. **AMEND THE NICE TREATY**

On the proposal of Comhairleoir T. Brosnan, seconded by Comhairleoir D. Boyle An Chomhairle approved the following motion:-
