## 3. **MINUTES**

Ordinary Meeting of An Chomhairle held on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2003 were considered and approved.

## 4. **QUESTION TIME**

### 4.1 **WATER PRESSURE AT CHURCH ROAD**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir D. Clune, a written reply was circulated which stated that at the northern end of Church Road, houses on both sides, about 34 in all were supplied by an old 100mm cast iron watermain on the eastern side of the road. This watermain is in poor condition. It is badly corroded, with a lot of scale on the inside, which reduced the cross-sectional area, and hence the flow and pressure in the pipe. In addition there have been breaks (leaks) from time to time on this main, which further reduced the flow and pressure.

There also exists a 150mm main on the western side of the road, which served only one premises (the school) and Barnstead Estate, in the area in question. It is a much newer pipe than the 100mm.

Before Christmas the 100mm main was linked across the road to the 150mm main, to boost the supply in the 100mm main. This resulted in improved pressure. We also commenced transferring the supply pipe (service pipe) of each premises on the western side, to the adjacent 150mm pipe.

After Christmas we continued transferring the supply pipe of each premises on the western side to the 150mm pipe, and this work is now complete. We also discovered and repaired a leak on the 100mm main.

Our plan is to replace the 100mm C.I. main with 63mm HDPE pipe; about 125m in length at the southern end (from around Barnstead Estate to the Church) for 12 premises, and about 45m north of the school, for 10 premises. We have completed two other road crossings in 100mm ductile iron (D.I.) pipe which will supply the proposed HDPE main. We are currently cutting the road surface in preparation for laying the HDPE pipe; we expect to commence pipe-laying next week. On completion, the 100mm pipe will be decommissioned.

4.2 **SEWER SYSTEM ON TOGHER RD**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir S. Martin, a written reply was circulated which stated that the sewer on Togher Road flows from the head manhole just south of Ardmanning Avenue in a northerly direction towards the Lough and the junction with Pearse Road. There was a problem in the past with a blockage on this line resulting in sewage appearing on the roadway.

Remedial work was carried out which resolved this problem, however, the sewer can still sometimes surcharge in very heavy rain resulting in ponding on the roadway.

I will have the sewer jetted and have a CCTV survey carried out to see if there are any remaining restrictions. However, it may be necessary, ultimately, to lay an overflow pipe over the existing pipe for a distance of 100m. This will depend on the results of the CCTV survey and specific funding being made available for this purpose.
