3. **QUESTION TIME**

3.1 **DISABLED PERSONS GRANT SCHEME**

In response to question submitted by Seanoir Terry Shannon, the following written response was circulated which stated that:

(a) The number of applicants to Cork City Council for a Disabled Grant for the following years 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003.

(c) The grant allocation sought by Cork City Council from Central Government for the following years 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003

No formal application as sought from Central Government under the disabled persons grant scheme. Funding is provided through the recoupment process whereby Cork City Council can recoup two-thirds of the amount of a grant allocation up to a maximum of €20,320 for private grants.

(d) The grant allocation given to Cork City Council by Central Government for the following years 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003

As previously stated, funding was provided through the recoupment process. In 2003, Cork City Council through its revenue budget provided approximately €900,000 for disabled persons grants, two-thirds of which is recoupable from the Department of Environment and Local Government.

(e) The total amount of resources of Cork City Council which were allocated towards the Disabled Persons Grant Scheme for the following years 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003

Other resources involved include administrative and technical personnel backup to aid implementation of the scheme.

(f) The criteria that is used when determining which applicants are High Priority, Medium Priority, Low Priority.

The prioritisation process for the disabled persons grants scheme and the criteria determining high, medium or low priority (see below):

The persons involved in the decision making process for disabled persons grants include personnel from the disabled persons grants section, the Occupational Therapist, Building Inspectors, Architects and Engineering personnel, where appropriate.

Medical reports from private GP's which are submitted with each application will be considered also when making the decision.

(g) An occupational therapist was employed by Cork City Council in December 2000. The total cost for the services of the occupational therapist for 2001, 2002 and 2003, are as follows:

A breakdown of the prioritisation process Guidelines

High Priority One – *Health and Safety*, where modification of the task is not possible or the person is a danger to themselves or others.

High Priority Two – *Health and Hygiene*, where the only option is to provide showering facilities

Medium Priority One – *Carers Health*, where support will lead to breakdown of the family care situation

Medium Priority Two – *Supervision*, for challenging behaviour or severe epilepsy for example

Low Priority-*Quality of Life*

All applications are prioritised after assessment by an Occupational Therapist and with medical information supplied by the applicants General Practitioner.

3.2 **‘CITY NEIGHBOURHOODS’ COMPETITION**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir Tom O’ Driscoll, the following written reply was circulated which stated that ‘City Neighbourhoods’ is a new national competition for residential and commercial districts in the five major cities of Cork, Dublin, Galway, Limerick and Waterford, organised by the Tidy Towns Unit of the Department of Environment and Local Government. The objective of the new competition is to improve the quality of life of all city dwellers by making our cities more attractive places to live, work or visit.

Cork City Council will enter the highest achievers from certain categories of the 2002 Tidy Districts and Better Buildings and Street Environment Competition. All entries have to comply with the criteria set down by the Tidy Towns Unit of the Department of Environment, and will compete for the titles of:

Best Residential Area (50 houses or more)

Best Urban Village

Best City Street

with one overall winner of the title of Best City Neighbourhood.

3.3 **CAR PARK SPACES ON FATHER MATTHEW QUAY AND MORRISON’S QUAY**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir Deirdre Clune, the following written reply was circulated which stated that the car parking spaces on Father Matthew Quay and Morrison’s Quay were removed on a temporary basis to facilitate the Cork Main Drainage (CMD) works. The relevant section of work has been completed and the parking spaces have now been returned to use by the public.

Further work is planned in the area in the near future, which will necessitate the temporary removal of some of the parking spaces again. The City Council will ensure that the number of spaces and period of removal is kept to a minimum.

3.4 **PROPOSED NEW BUILDING OF A CRECHE IN ARDMORE AVENUE**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir Jonathon O’ Brien, the following written reply was circulated which stated that the consultation process began in May 2001 when both City Council officials and the Barnardos Area Manager met with the Knocknaheeny Forum to discuss the potential role of Barnardos in Knocknaheeny. A series of meetings took place with the Forum in the intervening period.

Barnardos organised information meetings in the Community College on 1st May and 12th June, 2003.

An information leaflet outlining the project has been made available in the offices of the City Council (North West), We The People & RAPID.

A letter was issued to all residents immediately adjoining the facility stating that if residents could not attend the information meeting that an individual meeting could be organised. Three residents responded by telephone and one of the residents met with Barnardos.

It is now intended to formally begin the consultation process under the provisions of Part VIII of the Local Government (Planning & Development) Regulations, 2001.

3.5 **QUARRY ON THE BALLYHOOLEY ROAD**

In response to question submitted by Comhairleoir Billy Kelleher T.D., the following written reply was circulated which stated that the pruning of bushes and undergrowth was carried out at this location in late April, early May. Additional pruning works will be carried out within two weeks and on a scheduled basis approximately every four weeks.

3.6 **WORK CARRIED OUT IN ONSLOW GARDENS**

In response to question submitted by Seanoir Dave McCarthy, the following written reply was circulated which stated that it is planned to undertake Road Lining (Stop lines) and Traffic Signage (Yield Signs) in Onslow Gardens this year. It is hoped to commence work on the ground later in the summer.
