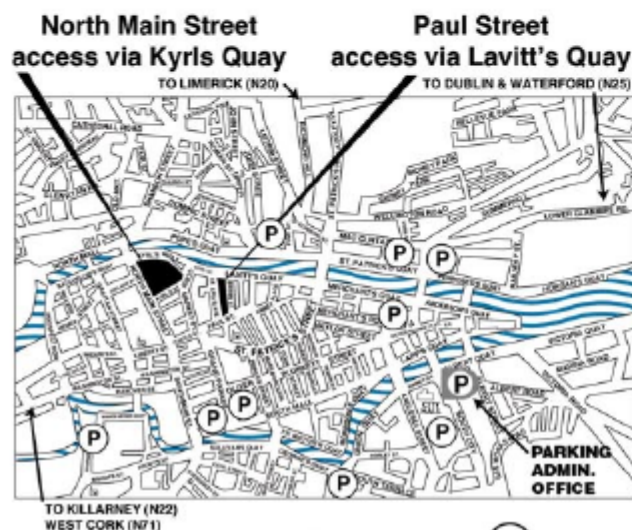

### Public Car Parks (P)

#### Towing and Clamping:

Tow Away and Clamping is in operation in Cork City. It is operated by a private contractor on behalf of Cork City Council in accordance with Cork City Council policy.

#### Appeals Service for Clamping & Tow-Away Operations

Cork City Council is committed to ensuring that complaints and appeals are managed in a confidential, responsive and fair manner. Cork City Council operate a Tow-Away and Clamping Service as a traffic management measure to deter illegal parking.

#### Clearways/Bus Lanes

No parking or stopping during hours indicated on time plate. Clearway restrictions supersede all other parking restrictions.

#### Double Yellow Lines

No parking at any time except while actively loading/unloading for a maximum of 30 minutes.

#### Single Yellow Lines

No parking during hours indicated on the time plate (usually 8:30-18:30 Monday - Saturday), except while actively loading/unloading for a maximum of 30 minutes.

#### Disabled Parking Bays

No parking at any time except where a valid disabled persons parking permit is displayed in the vehicle. These permits are issued by the Irish Wheelchair Association and the Disabled Drivers Association and include a photograph and signature of the holder. **Disabled Drivers with a disabled parking permit have FREE parking in designated disabled parking areas and in all disc parking areas within the City Council area.**

#### Taxi Ranks/Bus Stops

Parking is not allowed at any time

#### Other Parking Restrictions

It is illegal to park in a way which interferes with traffic flow or obstructs or endangers other road users, for example:

Ambulance Bays or Fire Exits

On a footpath (either partly or wholly).

Within 5 metres of a junction.

Within 15 metres on the approach side or 5 metres on the other side of a pedestrian crossing or traffic lights.

Obstructing any entrance for vehicles except with the occupier's consent.

On a grass margin or median strip

#### Where to buy discs:

Parking Discs are available in booklets of 5 costing €6.25 or individually for €1.25 through appointed outlets showing the sign

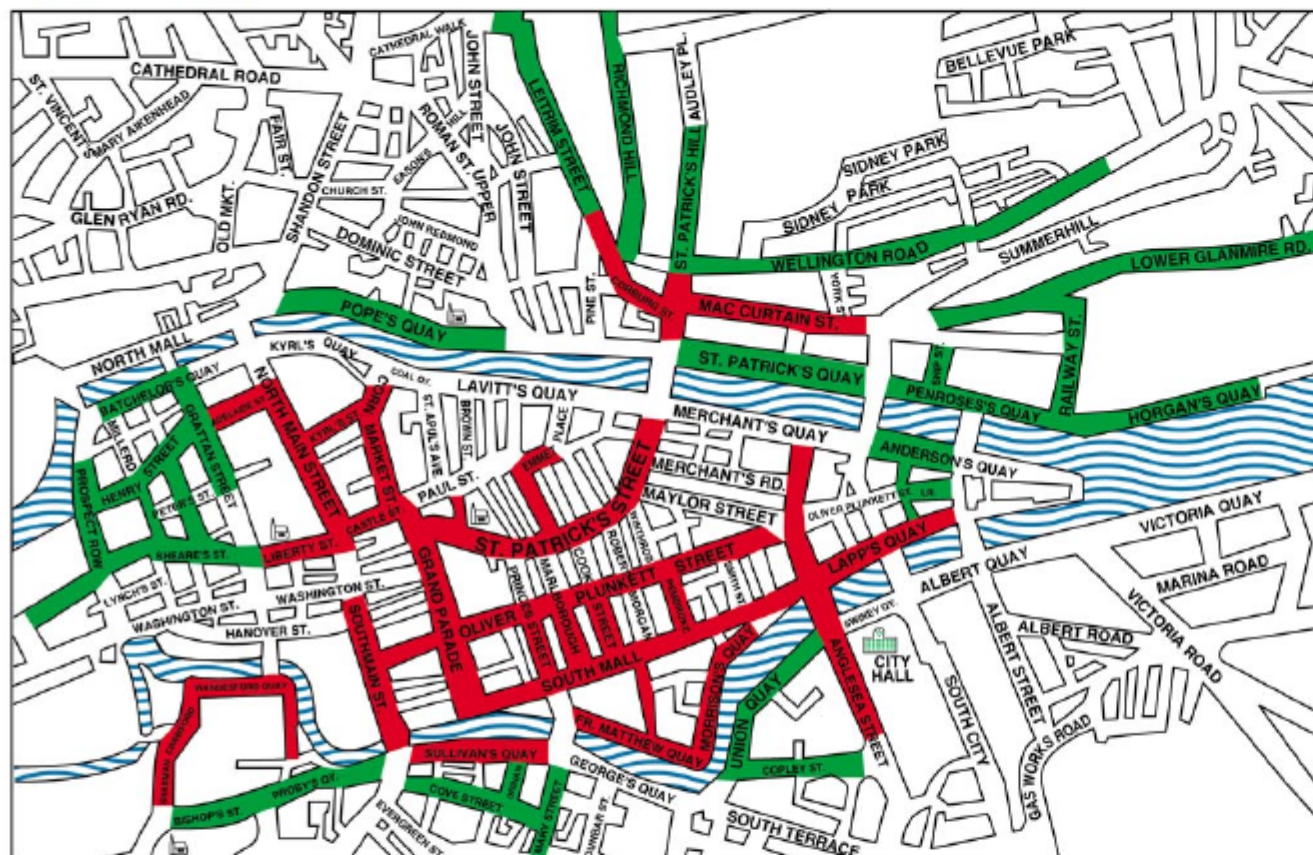

Cork City Council operates a Disc Parking system of Payment for parking in Cork City Centre. Cars parked in a Disc Parking area (as indicated by on street parking signs and information plates) must display a valid parking disc. The Parking limit in each area will be identified by the normal parking sign – the letter 'P' in a circle and an information plate showing the time allocated in the area.

#### Parking Regulations & Bye-Laws:

All of the parking regulations are designed to make life in Cork City safer, more pleasant, more orderly and more convenient for everyone. They are intended to help all road users by:

improving road safety - eliminating obstructions - reducing congestion - increasing the turnover of on street parking spaces

Remember, it is the motorists' responsibility to ensure that they are complying with the regulations when they park their vehicle on the street. A copy of the Cork City Council Disc Parking Areas Bye-Laws is available from the Parking Services Office, Cork City Council, Albert Quay House, Albert Quay, Cork. National Parking Regulations can be obtained from the Government Publications Office, Sun Alliance House, Molesworth Street, Dublin 2.

Please scratch out the Year, Month, Day, Hour and Minute (to nearest 5 minutes) to commence your paid parking.

#### INSTRUCTIONS

On arrival fully scratch off appropriate panels (a pinhole dot will not suffice) on the disc – year – month – day – hour – minute (to the nearest next five minutes).

Attach the distinctly marked disc to the inside of the vehicle (display in window nearest kerb) so that it can be easily read from outside the vehicle.

The maximum parking time allowed is shown on the information plates on the signposts.

**On expiry of disc, vehicle must be removed and not reparked on the same street for at least 1 hour. Use of more than one disc or replacement of disc is not permitted.**

Unexpired time on disc can be used at other disc parking places (not on the same street) within the time limit.
