4.2 'In light of the ongoing demographic change and the emergence of many new families living in the area, that a new playground be made a priority for delivery in Ballinlough. The current very small playground in Ballinlough Swimming Pool Park is out of date and is not fit for purpose for such an area with a rapidly growing number of families.'

4.3 'That the lines for the car parking spaces at the start of Blackrock Amenity adjacent to Blackrock Castle be re-painted as they are faded. In particular drivers are unable to note the delineations of the designated wheelchair spaces'

4.4 'That Council give a written report in relation to the status of the derelict house/s (which has been vacant for many years and an eyesore to the adjacent residents) in Pinecroft, Grange and confirm if Council can proceed to CPO the site in order to build much needed houses for those who need them.'

Such a move would enable motorists to temporarily cross into the other lane of traffic, go around any bus stopped at said bus stop and proceed through the traffic lights to Douglas West. This, in turn, would go a long way towards easing traffic congestion on Donnybrook Hill.'

5.4 'That CCC immediately act on promises made to the residents of Castle Meadows and Councillors without any further delay.

Firstly, to address the parking issues at the entrance of the park which are making the turn very dangerous, while following through with adequate signage and lining in the park.

Secondly, address the pedestrian access on the eastern side of the park i.e. the river side.

Lastly, the pressing issue of anti social behaviour around the playground area. Nightly fires are now a reality with the fire brigade service in attendance on at least five times recently. The solution, address the inadequate fence which is enabling the anti social behaviour, introduce better lighting and cameras. The excuse of not taking in charge is not good enough.'
