5. 90 minutes free parking in urban villages;
6. Disincentives to prevent landlords from leaving units vacant or rendering the un-rentable”.

Cork City Council calls on the Oireachtas to fully investigate the Insurance industry explanations for these increases and ensure that the rationale behind the valuations of premiums are based on sound actuary practices and are found to be in line with European industry norms.’
