9.6 **TRAFFIC LIGHTS AT THE EXIT OF CURRAHEEN ESTATE**

‘Curraheen Estate has only 1 entrance in & out of the estate. Due to the volume of traffic from the Ring Road /link road and coming up Curraheen Road and driving so fast as well as cars parked on the corner of the estate, drivers exiting the estate cannot see the traffic coming unless they pull out onto the road which is going to cause a very serious accident if this is left to continue. Added to that if the bus stops at the bus stop you can’t see the traffic coming down the road. There is going to be a very serious accident going to happen at the estate unless something is done immediately to prevent it. I propose with the agreement of the residents of Curraheen Estate that traffic lights be installed at the exit of the estate to allow the traffic exit the estate safely. There could be sensors put on these lights as not to hold up the flow of traffic on the Curraheen Road.’

15. **MOTIONS**

15.1 **USE OF CHAIRS AND TABLES OUTSIDE BARS, RESTAURANTS AND CAFES**

The following motion was deferred from the meeting of An Chomhairle held 24th October 2016:-

‘That Cork City Council rejects the governments implementation and extreme charge hike on the use of chairs and tables outside bars, restaurants and cafes, and request that each local authority regulate its own fixed charge in tandem with local economy.’

15.2 **POST BOX WITHIN EDEN ESTATE AND BLACKROCK HALL**

The following motion was deferred from the meeting of An Chomhairle held 24th October 2016:-

‘Cork City Council calls on An Post to assess the feasibility of providing a post box within the Eden Estate & Blackrock Hall that would benefit many residents & businesses in the area.’

15.3 **OPERATION OF TICKETMASTER AND ITS SISTER COMPANY SEATWAVE**

‘That in light of recent concert ticket sale controversy - and indeed the ongoing investigation into the sale of Olympic tickets in this country - the appropriate arm of central government is called upon by Cork City Council to investigate the operation of Ticketmaster and its sister company Seatwave in a bid to ensure proper regulations and practices are in place to ensure transparency and the absence of profiteering when it comes to the open sale of event tickets to the public.’

15.4 **CHANGE TO GOVERNMENT POLICY ON HAP AND RAS SCHEMES**

‘That Cork City Council would write to the Government requesting a change to government policy so that tenants on the HAP and RAS schemes since 2011 would not be removed from the social housing waiting list because Cork City Council does not consider that those housed under HAP and RAS have had their social housing need met or that HAP and RAS are adequate forms of social housing.’

15.5 **PUBLIC HEALTH (ALCOHOL) BILL**

‘That Cork City Council supports the Public Health (Alcohol) Bill currently being considered by the Dáil. The measures proposed for inclusion in the Public Health (Alcohol) Bill, brought forward address the key areas of alcohol-harm reduction, including the pricing, marketing and availability of alcohol. Among other measures, the bill will provide for:- The introduction of minimum pricing; Regulation of the marketing and advertising of alcohol; Health labeling of alcohol products; Enforcement powers to be given to Environmental Health Officers in relation to sale; supply and consumption of alcohol products’
