As winter is rapidly approaching Cork City Council has reflected on its response to the cold spells in recent years. Cork City Council in any cold spell has to give priority to the primary traffic network within the City. During previous year s' cold spells many community groups requested supplies of salt so that they themselves could treat local problematic areas. In response to this, Cork City Council will again make salt available to community groups. The salt will come in up to one ton bags. The community groups who request the salt will have to provide a secure location where the salt can be delivered and stored. The provision of the salt is primarily intended to empower local communities to help themselves during a cold spell. It is not intended for personal use as individuals would be expected to acquire their own salt supplies. Once distributed to a community group the salt will become the property of the same community group. Cork City Council will not be responsible for the storage, distribution, application or usage of salt by community groups or individuals who are members of a community group or third parties. Cork City Council will not be responsible for any issues of liability which arise from the storage, distribution, application or usage of the salt. These are matters for each community group to whom salt has been supplied.
