

**CORK CITY COUNCIL 2026****LOCAL HERITAGE AND BIODIVERSITY PUBLICATION GRANT SCHEME**

Applications are sought by Cork City Council for the Local Heritage and Biodiversity Publication Grant Scheme 2026. This grant scheme is an action from the Cork City Heritage and Biodiversity Plan 2021 – 2026 [Heritage and Biodiversity Plan - Cork City Council](#) which outlines the aims and objectives of Cork City Council with respect to Heritage and Biodiversity. Grant aid is distributed in accordance with these aims and objectives. For the purpose of these grant schemes **Heritage is deemed to include Archaeology, Built Heritage, Natural Heritage and Cultural Heritage.**

**Local Heritage and Biodiversity Publication Grant Scheme**

**Funding of a maximum of 90% of the total cost of the publication (not including voluntary labour) is available.** The local Heritage and Biodiversity publication grants scheme has funding of between €1000 and €4000 per publication grant. A total of up to €12,000 will be available for this grant scheme.

This grant scheme is aimed at supporting the publication and printing of high-quality books on local Heritage and Biodiversity topics which raise awareness and appreciation of local Heritage and Biodiversity in Cork City. The Heritage and Biodiversity topics should be of local Heritage and Biodiversity significance which have never been covered before or have a unique or innovative perspective. Innovation can include taking a fresh approach to addressing a particular topic, drawing attention to a little-known field of Heritage and Biodiversity and creating alliances of unusual project partners. This grant scheme is a competitive process and priority will be given to publications from local historians, Heritage and Biodiversity and community groups and non-profit organizations. Consideration will be given to publications from academic institutions and research students provided the local Heritage and Biodiversity interest is clearly demonstrated. Reprints of out of date historical books will be considered when the heritage value of such a reprint is clearly demonstrated and as resources allow. Low priority projects include those that already have secured publishers, printing leaflets, periodicals, conference proceedings, sports, tourism or promotional publications. The publication of theses will not be considered.

**The closing date for submission of applications is 11am on the 6<sup>th</sup> of February 2026.**

## LOCAL HERITAGE AND BIODIVERSITY PUBLICATION GRANT SCHEME CRITERIA

- **Funding of a maximum of 90% of the total cost of the publication (not including voluntary labour) to a maximum of €4,000 is available.**
- Applications shall be accompanied by a **draft of the entire book** as well as a sample of the intended illustrations and photographs, so it is clear what is being proposed. The proposed publication should be nearly print ready as the book must be completed by the end of the year.
- Publications must refer to topics relevant to Cork City Council's administrative area and must be clearly Heritage and Biodiversity related.
- Applications should be accompanied with details of how the book is to be financed ie matching funding (10% requirement) and efforts to secure other sources of income. Where applicable details of funding from other sections from Cork City Council must be outlined. In addition, details on intended number of copies produced, distribution plan, estimated sales, recommended retail price, projected profits etc. shall also be submitted.
- Applicants are advised to secure 3 quotes for publishing and/or printing costs and shall submit details of selected printer and/ or publisher where available.
- Applicants are encouraged to have the work peer reviewed and copy edited.
- Applications should be made by the author or Local Heritage and Biodiversity group not by a publisher or agent.
- Funding will not be available for research costs or travel and other administration costs.
- Cork City Council will accept no responsibility or liability for costs and expenses incurred as a direct or indirect consequence of the publication or statements in connection with the project/ publication to include without limitation statements in any books, publications or reports which are alleged to be plagiarism, libelous, offensive, or defamatory.
- Priority will be given to applicants who participate in Heritage Week
- The applicant must publicise the publication e.g. press release, poster, walk, talk etc.
- 1 copy of the publication will be made available to the Heritage Officer and 2 copies to Cork City Libraries, Local History section.
- A pdf of the cover should be provided for the Cork City Council website.
- **The support of Cork City Council for the project must be acknowledged. Wording and appropriate logo will be provided on acceptance of grant.**

- This grant cannot fund projects retrospectively.
- The project should link to an objective or action from the Cork City Heritage and Biodiversity Plan 2021 – 2026 [Heritage and Biodiversity Plan - Cork City Council](#)

**All completed publications must be submitted to Cork City Council by 2pm on the 4<sup>th</sup> of December 2026**
