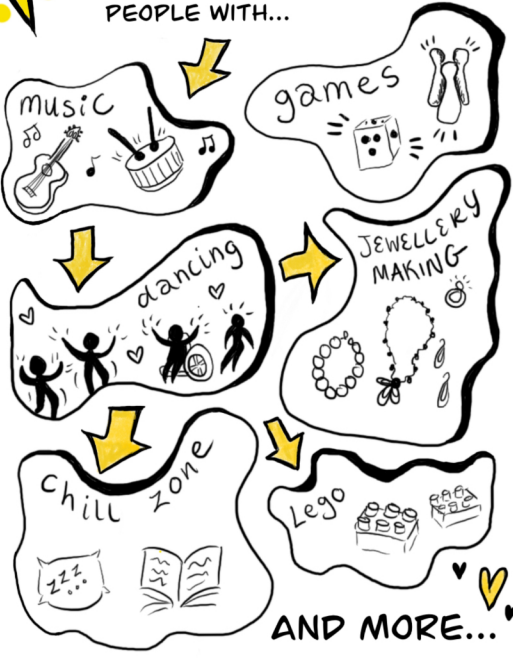


WE HELD A FUN, INCLUSIVE YOUTH EVENT FOR 120 YOUNG PEOPLE WITH...
