About the Venue

This section is a guide on travelling to Cork City Hall. Different activities are happening in different areas of the Cork City Hall building on Culture Night.

Millennium Hall is a large room inside the large stone building called Cork City Hall.

Planning Your Visit

- The show will be relaxed and encourages expression vocalising, stimming, and movement are encouraged!
- You are welcome to bring along your favourite cuddly toy, sensory aids or fidget toys if that will enable you to enjoy the show more
- You are welcome to bring your own ear defenders. We have a few ear defenders you can borrow. We need these back after the show.
- Millennium Hall is fully wheelchair accessible, with an accessible bathroom
- Guide dogs and therapy animals are welcome
- Buggy & walker parking is available at the back of the hall

Getting to City Hall

City Hall is located near the centre of Cork City Find City Hall –

- On foot: Between Eglinton Street and Anglesea Street
- By bus: Served by multiple city bus routes (see next page). Also,
 Parnell Place Bus Station is approximately a 5 minute walk away
- By car: These is paid parking near the show at City Hall QPark
- By train: Kent train station is approximately a 15 minute walk away



Bus Information for Cork City Hall

There are two bus stops outside City Hall. One is on Angelsea St and the other is on Eglinton St.

Eglinton St Bus Stop – the closest to Millennium Hall

These are the buses that stop outside City Hall: 203, 206, 207, 213, 214, 215, 216, 220, 223 These are the buses that stop a short walk from City Hall: 209a, 225, 226, 228, 236, 239.

More Bus Information for Cork City Hall

The main stop for City Hall is located on **Anglesea Street**, right beside the building. It's centrally located and easily accessible from:

- ·Lapps Quay
- Parnell Place Bus Station (major hub nearby)
- South Mall

Where to go when you get to City Hall

- Millennium Hall is part of City Hall, on the Eglinton Street side of the building, beside the bus stop. You will see a planted garden area and steps into Millennium Hall Foyer.
- Wheelchair users can enter City Hall by the ramp on Terence McSwiney Quay. There will be a guide at that entrance to show you the way to Millennium Hall Foyer.

These photos will give you an idea of what these spaces look like when empty. Both will be set up in a different way for **Squish Stomp Spin – The Magic of Stim**. For example, there will be more seating and a low stage for the performer.

There will be a Quiet Space to the side of Millennium Hall and an Active Zone in Millennium Hall Foyer.

Friendly volunteers will help you find your way, answer questions and provide printed copies of the Show Guide and Venue Guide. Digital copies of both can be accessed via QR codes.

Show Set Up and Seating

- If it will make you feel more comfortable, you can reserve a seat at the show by phoning 021 492 4000 between 10:00 and 16:00 up to the 15th September – but this is not necessary.
- There will be both mats and chairs in front of the stage you can sit, lie down or move as you like
- Moss will perform on a low stage
- At the end of the show, some of the audience will be invited to join Moss on the riser
- A photographer will take photos of Moss on the stage. You can choose to be part of this or not – either is fine.



Break Out Space - The Active Zone

In Millennium Hall Foyer, the *Active Zone is a* space for audience members who want to be loud, energetic, and expressive. Feel free to come and go as you like.

- Soft beanbags
- Bubbles to play with
- Room to move and stim

We kindly ask that children in The Active Zone be accompanied by parents or guardians.



Quiet Space - The Chill Zone


Need a break? The Chill Zone is a quiet space inside the main hall, in a small cosy storage area that is available to a limited number of people.

In this space, you will find:

- Mats and cushions
- Soft, low lighting
- A calm, quiet atmosphere
- · A friendly volunteer to help if needed
