



WASTE AND LITTER ENFORCEMENT (PRIVACY NOTICE)

- Purpose** Cork City Council has a duty to ensure that Cork City is kept free from litter and waste. This Council has significant powers under waste and litter legislation to tackle illegal waste and litter activity. Your information collected by us is generally limited to

Complaints received- contact details provided in respect of complaints received

Breaches of the legislation- Contact details obtained following detection and investigation of breaches of the law.

- Lawful Basis** The legal basis for the collection of this data is provided for under The Circular Economy and Miscellaneous Provisions Act 2022
Section 70 of the Data Protection Act 2018: Processing for the purposes of law enforcement.
Waste Management Act 1996 and Litter Pollution Act 1997: Specific provisions for waste and litter enforcement
Therefore Article 6 (1) (c) and (e) applies.

- Information Sharing** The information you provide may be shared with the following:

- Other relevant Directorates of Cork City Council.
- Law enforcement agencies and 3rd parties to assist us in the detection, investigation, and prosecution of waste and litter offences.
- Waste enforcement personnel: For operational purposes.
- Legal representatives or the courts: Where CCTV footage is required as evidence for prosecution.
- Data processors who may be engaged to operate a CCTV system and process CCTV data on our behalf.

All data sharing is conducted under strict agreements to ensure your privacy is protected

- Cork City Council may, for the purpose of its functions under the legislation, request and obtain information at any time from:

- Other local authorities

- Sources where you have chosen to make your information publicly available, such as social media sites

5. Retention Your information will be retained for

- (i) where enforcement action is taken for duration of investigation and enforcement action plus a further 7 years; Then offer significant cases, only, (destroy insignificant cases) to archivist for archiving or
- (ii) where no enforcement action* is taken destroyed after 6 months from date when offence took place. Exception being those cases where either enforcement actions and legal proceedings have been initiated. Where this occurs keep these records until all enforcement and legal proceedings including appeals have been exhausted.
Register of fines - for 2 years then anonymise this Register.

6. Your Data Protection Rights

You have the right to request access to personal data held about you, obtain confirmation as to whether data concerning you exists, be informed of the content and source of data and check its accuracy.

7. Right of Complaint to the Office of the Data Protection Commissioner

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of the response you received from Cork City Council in relation to your data subject access request, then you are entitled to make a complaint to the Data Protection Commissioner who may investigate the matter for you.
